SINGAPORE YOUTH FESTIVAL 2023

Since its beginnings in 1966, the Singapore Youth Festival (SYF) has provided generations of students with a national platform through which they share their love and appreciation of the arts with the community, develop strength of character and forge life-long friendships. Today, the SYF comprises the Arts Presentation, Art Exhibition, and Celebrations. It is a meaningful experience for many of our students in schools, and a reflection of the unique and important role that the arts play in a holistic education.

The SYF Art Exhibition featuring artworks from primary schools, and secondary schools/junior colleges/millennia institute in alternate years, is organised to provide opportunities for our students to showcase their artistic talents and to promote art appreciation in our schools.

ARTIST & INSPIRATION

The Singapore Youth Festival 2023 Art Exhibition theme 'Artist and Inspiration' aims to nurture in students a keen appreciation for historical and cultural influences in art. Primary school student artists are invited to submit original creations inspired by artworks collection in the 2024 revised Primary art syllabus, comprising artworks by artists in Singapore and the world.

The exhibition presents more than 500 artworks by students from over 190 Primary Schools, Full Schools (Primary Section) and Special Education Schools via the online gallery on the SYF website and selected artworks on-site at the Stamford Arts Centre.

MESSAGE FROM GUEST - OF - HONOUR



Art is a language. It conveys ideas, connects thoughts and invites us to feel. A visual may be mute. But it has the power to inspire and move us, and even change the way we think, feel and act.

Personally, I am very moved by *Black Forest* (2016) by local artist Han Sai Por. To me, the artist grieves about a possible future where life is lost, leaving behind only charred remains. There is no finger pointing. Yet her silent lamentation shouts more loudly than somebody with a megaphone - Act now or we will not have a future! The visuals of

black, burnt-out stumps and dryness deplore the conditions of our heart if we don't all do our part. For there is nowhere to retreat to, no other earth, no other safe space.

Only human beings have art. Exhibitions like our annual Singapore Youth Festival Art Exhibition remind us of our humanity.

The theme of this year's exhibition **Artist and Inspiration** showcases how our student artists are inspired by the artwork collection in the 2024 revised Primary art syllabus. Our students can appreciate history and culture, and can respond with their unique "voice".

I am thrilled that all the Primary schools in Singapore as well as sixteen Special Education schools have contributed to this year's exhibition. The tremendous support of schools and mentorship of primary art teachers deserve special mention! Thank you for enabling our students' creative voices and nurturing their artistic talents.






Artist Statement

Using Art as a tool to share and educate our vouna students is important. It is a very interesting way to preserve and creating awareness on this long lost street culture.



The team conceptualised the idea from scratch to the creation of the masterpiece. Working together with the school value of love, their bond made the process seamless when it came to tough decisions making.




















Students first brainstormed about the global contemporary issues and considered which were the most relatable to them. They then share ideas of their individual concerns with their groupmates through their sketches.


