SYF 2023 Celebrations Open Call The Young Playwright Presents

A. OVERVIEW

Have a passion for writing and performing? Want to work on ideas from page to stage? Now you have the chance to showcase an original masterpiece!

Join *The Young Playwright Presents*, a platform in this year's SYF 2023 Celebrations! Through *The Young Playwright Presents*, we aim to provide an opportunity for you to be the next young playwright! You can create your own 1 – 3 minutes long monologue* and perform it as a staged performance** from the comforts of your home.

This platform is open to all students in MOE schools (Primary, Secondary and Pre-University levels), and Special Education schools.

*a monologue is a short play performed by one actor only

**an actual stage is <u>not</u> required; you may use existing furniture or props from your home or create your own set

B. THEME

I. The theme for *The Young Playwright Presents* this year is

- II. Some questions to guide your process:
 - What are some small gestures that are often overlooked but have made a significant impact on your life?
 - In what ways can small actions make a big difference in someone's life?
 - Who (i.e., parents, bus drivers etc.) or what (i.e., place, animal, song, object etc.) have you come to cherish? What significance did it have on your life?
 - How can you inspire others to make a difference through simple acts of kindness?



C. HOW TO PARTICIPATE IN *THE YOUNG PLAYWRIGHT PRESENTS*

	word file in A4-size with font "Arial", font size 12) and last between $1-3$			
	minutes when performed.

Step 3:	Practise and video record your performance.			
	Perform the monologue <u>as if it was presented on stage for an audience</u> , with full physical and vocal expressions. You may utilise a set, furniture, prop(s) and costume(s), where appropriate. For example, the performer could be dressed as a cat appreciating the stray feeders in the neighbourhood if it fits the purpose of the monologue.			
	There must be no complex and/or risky set-ups and dangerous attempts when filming.			
	The use of one or more of the following videography equipment is allowed:			
	 Smart devices (e.g. phone, tablet etc.) with videography capabilities Digital cameras 			
Step 4:	Check that your entry is ready for submission. Use this checklist to help you ensure that the original script(s) you have			
	written and video clip(s) you have recorded meet the criteria for submission. CHECKLIST			

Step 5: Upload the video clip(s) and your original script(s) on Dropbox or Google Drive.

When sharing on Google drive, make sure that the link sharing setting is set to "Anyone with the link can view".



Each student or group may submit <u>up to two entries</u>. Name your entry/ entries in the following format:

All submissions must reach us by 26 May 2023, 5pm.

You will be required to fill in these details on the online form:

- Full name of participant (these will be used on the certificate(s) you will receive)
- School(s)
- Academic level(s) (e.g. Primary 4 / Secondary 1)
- Contact number
- Email address
- Parents'/ Guardians' name and contact
- Links to WeTransfer, Dropbox or Google Drive folder with your video clip and script
- A short paragraph (up to 100 words) explaining the inspiration behind your monologue. Please note that this paragraph may be edited by the organiser if your entry is shortlisted.

You will be notified via e-mail if your video clip and script has been shortlisted, whether in part or in full.

All shortlisted video clips will be featured on the SYF YouTube channel, website and/or social media platforms (Facebook and Instagram) as part of SYF Celebrations 2023.

Incomplete entries, video clips with poor audio/video quality, links that do not work or fail to download will not be considered. See Section D for notes on filming.

All students with a valid submission will receive an e-certificate for their participation, which can be reflected in their CCA record upon submission to their form teacher/CCA teachers.



D. WHAT TO TAKE NOTE OF WHEN CREATING AND FILMING YOUR PERFORMANCE

1. Specifications for the video recording:

Layout: Landscape mode

Quality: 1920 X 1080 HD / Handphone HD Video Recording

Format: .mp4 or .mov file

2. Positioning:

- Film against a solid-coloured background or wall, where possible.
- · Check that the performer can be clearly seen while filming.

3. Environment:

- · Record in a quiet space in your house.
- Ensure that there is good lighting.
- Ensure a safe space for movement while performing.
- 4. Submissions will be shortlisted for feature based on the following criteria:
 - Clarity of Presentation: The message and intent of the presentation are clear and effectively delivered through the video recording.
 - **Creativity**: The script is original and innovative in approaching the theme with a clear intended dramatic effect on the audience.
 - Audience Engagement: The performance engages the audience with apt use of physical and/or vocal expressivity.



E. WHAT TO WEAR

- 1. Choice of style and appearance should be modest and appropriate for *The Young Playwright Presents* and audience on Ministry of Education (MOE) and Singapore Youth Festival (SYF) social media platforms.
- 2. Refer to the table below for guidelines:

Attire	 ✓ Wear modest and age-appropriate attire that allows you to move with ease and safely. ✓ Wear attire of a different colour from the background. ✓ All colours (preferably bright ones) are welcome, but predominantly black outfits are discouraged. ✓ Wear attire that reflects your character (where possible). 	 Don't wear revealing attire (for example, clothing made of translucent materials, spaghettistrap tops, tube tops, crop tops, hot pants etc.). Don't wear attire that suggests drugs, tobacco, alcohol, violence, sexual content, religions or politics. Avoid shiny items (e.g. shiny buttons) to prevent glare in the video.
Hair	✓ Consider hairstyles that suit the character you are performing.	 Don't have hairstyles that cover facial features or block your vision.

Please note that entries that are deemed unsuitable, will not be featured on any of the MOE and SYF platforms.

F. HOW TO STAY SAFE WHEN PARTICIPATING IN THE YOUNG PLAYWRIGHT PRESENTS

To stay safe, ensure that:

- your submission(s) <u>does/do not</u> contain any depictions or activities that are deemed indecent, blasphemous, libellous, offensive, pornographic, politically insensitive, racially insensitive and unlawful.
- you adhere to socially acceptable netiquette when interacting with online material and comments on the MOE/SYF social media platforms.
- you do not participate in cyberbullying behaviours including, but not limited to, flaming, harassment, cyber stalking and denigration.



G. COPYRIGHT GUIDELINES TO TAKE NOTE OF

- 1. Participants are to ensure that they do not infringe copyrights or commit plagiarism in their submissions. Examples of copyright infringement or plagiarism may include:
 - i. Using music that is not copyright free (e.g., songs by well-known singers) in their audio recordings / video recordings.
 - ii. Featuring images belonging to another creator (e.g., brand logos, brand mascots, etc.) in their own photographs / videos without permission.
 - iii. Copying / modifying an existing work (e.g., scripts, movies, books, etc.) of another creator and using it in their submission without permission.
- 2. When submitting any photographs / audio recordings / video recordings to the Ministry of Education and Singapore Youth Festival, participants must:
 - i. **be the creator / owner of all the material** submitted (except where the platform has provided material for participants to work with).
 - ii. have sought permission from the owner(s) when using material from another source or person.
 - iii. have sought permission from any person(s) included in the submitted material.
- 3. In submitting any photographs / audio recordings/video recordings to SYF Celebrations 2023, a platform under the Ministry of Education (MOE), participants agree to grant the Government of Singapore a royalty-free, worldwide, irrevocable, perpetual, non-exclusive licence to use, modify, copy, publish, perform, communicate, and make available and / or broadcast the work (the "Licence") for non-commercial purposes.



STARTING TO BRAINSTORM

After planning and thinking through the theme and what it means to you, start the brainstorming process by thinking through these questions:





CREATIVE WRITING STRATEGIES

After thinking through the theme and coming up with ideas from the brainstorming process, try using these strategies as you write drafts to your monologue:

1. GENERATING	KEEP WATCH	
DRAFTS	 Time yourself and keep writing as much as you can without stopping for 5 minutes. 	
	<u>EMOTE</u>	
	 Write about some emotions the character goes through. It can be when he/she/it is feeling, e.g. hopeful/ happy/ strong/ angry/ frightened or ashamed. 	
	ALPHABET SOUP	
	 Start each sentence of the monologue with a letter of the alphabet. This will give you at least 26 sentences to start with. 	
2. FINALISE	Take the drafts and underline interesting and useful parts most relevant to the theme, and ideas generated for the monologue. Combine them in different ways to develop the monologue.	
3. IMPROVE	 Read the drafts aloud and change or remove words and sentences that are not telling the story according to your plans for the theme and your ideas from the brainstorming process. Rehearse the monologue with facial expressions, gestures and movements. Show what your character is doing/ thinking/ feeling without words.
